

## Woodcock wins again!

After receiving two awards last year—one for our Director of Education and the Edith Meffley Award from the Ridgefield Conservation Commission—Woodcock Nature Center was honored this spring with the **Green Community Partner of the Year Award** by Wilton Go Green. This recognition celebrates our partnership in promoting sustainability through programs like our free events, summer camp, after-school activities, field trips for local students, and more. We're proud to play a role in fostering a more environmentally conscious community.





Woodcock Nature Center is now a participating chapter of **FrogWatch USA**, a large-scale citizen science program that provides individuals, groups and families with opportunities to learn about wetlands in their communities by reporting on the calls of local frogs and toads. Woodcock held free volunteer training sessions so that individuals of all ages could get involved in this amazing citizen science program.

The long footbridge on our orange trail became twisted by rushing water and, several weighted floats that secure the bridge became completely dislodged. Thanks to a CT State recovery grant through the Women's Business Development Council, repairs were quickly made with little impact to programming. Ongoing support for trail and grounds maintenance comes from our community —thank you!
